School Description

The Crested Butte Community School (CBCS) is a K-12 college preparatory public school in Crested Butte, Colorado, with an enrollment of 706 students. CBCS is in its twenty-eighth year of operation and is a part of the Gunnison Watershed School District RE1J. CBCS is on a semester schedule and will continue a modified block for the sixth year. Eighty percent of seniors attend four year institutions after graduation.

CBCS continues to be acknowledged as an outstanding school. In the spring of 2024 *US News and World Report* named CBCS as a Best High School. Finally, 81% of our teachers hold a graduate degree or are currently enrolled in a graduate degree program.

Community Description

Crested Butte lies at the north end of the Gunnison Valley in southwestern Colorado, 230 miles southwest of Denver and 30 miles north of Gunnison, the home of Western State Colorado University. The town of Mt. Crested Butte is three miles north of Crested Butte and is the site of the local ski area, Crested Butte Mountain Resort. Crested Butte and Mt. Crested Butte have a combined population of 2,500. Originally a mining town, the economy is now based on tourism and ranching.

Advanced Placement Courses

CBSS has an open enrollment policy for AP courses, and the AP exam is required for all students enrolled in AP courses. In 2024, CBCS students took a total of 126 exams. For exams taken during the spring of 2024, eighty-nine percent of student scores were a three or above, and fifty-eight percent of scores were a four or above. While every AP course is not offered every year, the following advanced placement courses are offered annually or on a rotating basis for students:
